Two day multi-disciplinary international webinar on *Social Formation and Cultural Developments of Northeast India and the Neighboring Regions* was organized by Research Cell, Don Bosco College Kohima in association with Kohima Educational Society, on 24th and 25th July 2020. The programme was conducted through Google meet and the technical support was provided by National Institute of Electronics & Information Technology, Kohima.

10th to 12th August, 2020: 3 Day workshop on Basic Online Teaching

Since the global pandemic of COVID-19 and closure of educational institutions along with all others, educational institutions in Nagaland too had to shift their base to virtual platforms to conduct classes online. To assist college and school teachers in this crucial shift from traditional to virtual teaching, the Department of Education, Don Bosco College Kohima with support from Nagaland Board of School Education conducted a three day workshop on Basics of Online Teaching from 10th to 12th August 2020.

- Constitution, Abolition and Inclusion of the Committees and Clubs.

Action taken:

- ✓ For the first agenda the council decided to come up with a proper code of conduct for the faculty and students. Therefore the members decided to refer to the Service Rules framed by the college. The members will make a first draft and will submit it to the coordinator. The coordinator will look into it and will make a final one and will forward it to IQAC for approval.

- ✓ For the second agenda the council decided to follow the Curriculum as designed by the Nagaland University
- ✓ For the third agenda the council decided to make sure the teacher in charge of each NAAC Criteria to look into the proposed plans and to execute at least two from the IQAC Vision 2025 with effect from the current semester.
- ✓ For the fourth agenda the council decided to make the HoDs to implement at least one proposed vision related to the department as laid down by the IQAC Vision 2025.
- ✓ For the fifth agenda the council came up with the following regulations:
 - Eligibility of the HoD : Two Years Teaching Experience in Don Bosco College Kohima.
 - Tenure of the HoD : Three Years
- ✓ For the sixth agenda the council observed that the workloads of the HoDs at present were heavy and some of the faculties have less responsibility. The council felt the need for equal work distribution for smooth function of the college. Therefore the council had come up with the reshuffling of the duties and responsibilities of the faculties. The proposed duties were given below:

- HoDs Duties :Academic Council, IQAC, Admission Assistant Coordinator of the club
- Controller of Examination :Exam related works and one small Committee
- IQAC Coordinator : IQAC/ NAAC
- Faculties : Coordinators of Clubs and Committees

The council observed that the Staff Grievance Cell was looked after by Father's only therefore the council felt the need to include one teacher as a member so that the Cell can do justice to its motifs on which ground it was set up.

7. A request not to make the faculty shouldering the idea as shared by him or her.
8. Request to maintain a balance between the number of teaching faculties and the workload.
9. To provide almirahs for setting up of the department library of the department of Sociology.
10. Provision of EPF Scheme with the management's contribution of 13% share as per the rules of the scheme.
11. Provision of attached cupboard in the quarter
12. Request to add the honorarium for working 5 years in the college to faculty salary instead of giving it cash.
13. Inclusion of off period in the time table and cancellation of the repeat lectures of the elective papers.
14. Provision of separate washroom for the male and female faculties.
15. Request to develop a trust on the faculty who is shouldering a duty or responsibility.
16. Request for the provision of Transportations Service to the needy students and faculties.
