Jiji Kalavankal (Don Bosco Image, Institute of Media, Animation, Graphics and Effects), who was accompanied by eminent photographer Father Thomas. A total of 175 students of Don Bosco College attended the talk. Welcome address was given by the Principal, DBCK, Fr. Dr. P. Suresh and Felicitation by Dr. Adenuo Luikham (Eng. Dept. DBCK)

The talk was organised so that students can be equipped with the knowledge and skills that goes into videography and film-making. He talk was held as a part of the programme activity of the Movie Club of DBCK.

The speaker, Father Jiji Kalavankal, spoke on how an individual can start videography armed with the simplest gadgets. Having basic knowledge such as the right angles and continuity awareness can be crucial when making short-clips or longer films, and once equipped with these ideas, videography can be easily done even on ordinary mobile phones.

Report on participation of DBCK at the 4th e-Naga Summit; NBCC Convention Centre, Kohima on November 30, 2018:

The state's department of Information Technology & Communication (IT&C), Government of Nagaland, India in collaboration with e-Governance Academy of Estonia hosted the 4th e-Naga Summit in Kohima, Nagaland at NBCC Convention Centre. Honorable Governor of Nagaland P. B. Acharya graced the occasion as the Chief Guest along with the presence of minister of IT&C advisor, Shri MhonlumoKikon. The Governor of Nagaland, P. B Acharya in his brief speech made strong emphasis that the time has come for Nagaland to harness benefits of Information Technology (IT). Honorable Minister Advisor for IT&C, Shri MhonlumoKikon briefed about the importance of initiating & hosting such summits opening windows to access the benefits of Technology. The aim and the purpose of e-Naga Summit is to make Nagaland the IT hub in North East India along getting access to South East Asia said Advisor Minister M. Kikon. The event saw the presence of high dignitaries representing India, Estonia and from other countries in Europe. All the respective representatives presented papers and discussions on IT & C, conduct research & provide consultancy for successful conceptualization and implementation of e-Governance projects, contribution to promotion of digital culture at large. Representatives of the Government of Nagaland and e-Governance Academy, Estonia signed a MoU to develop and establish a state of Art e-Governance Academy in Nagaland. In order to reach the goal, the parties set out the following criteria's:

- (ii) Knowledge sharing.
- (iii) Designing E-Learning platform.
- (iv) Exchange programs for research workers, technologists, specialists and scholars.

Different institutions including Colleges, different government departments, NGO's participated the eNaga Summit. The second Semester of Don Bosco College, Kohima also participated the e-Naga Summit on invitation. Altogether 145 students accompanied by Teacher's, *MsSentuilie Asst. Prof Department of Education &MrZupenthung Asst. Prof Department of Political Science* DBCK attended the program. The program was scheduled at 10:00 hrs. After taking attendance from the college at 09;00 hrs the students boarded the four buses provided by IT&C department, Kohima Nagaland. The program had two sessions. After the first session ended, students and participants were given lunch, followed by the second session which started at 01:30 hrs. The Program on e-Summit ended successfully at 17:00 hrs.
