CONCEPT NOTE

The American philosopher George Santayana in his work, *The Life of Reason* (1905-1906) stated that "Those who cannot remember the past are condemned to repeat it." This quote has been re-echoed in multiple ways to highlight the importance of history to human society. To others who see history as a mere subject and it is mostly being narrowed down to a blunt recollection of what had happened. For numerous reasons the role of history and its contribution has always been viewed from limited sides and opinions, making it a close discipline rather than a bridge that connects the past with the present. It thus became obvious that lesser people are interested in history and in course of time they could not avail the benefits that it offers. In the light of the above quote, when history is forgotten, society ignores the mistakes and tends to repeat the follies over and again. As such new perspectives on history and history writing that focuses on the importance of memory, sources, facts, interpretation, objective analysis and so on, has widened the scope of history to a great extent. This is largely due to the inter-disciplinary approaches that history writing has adopted ranging from major developments in social issues, culture, economy, environment, politics and other spheres. In addition, contemporary histories immensely contribute to the understanding of the present from a close quarter.

Historically, societies of north-east India have rich cultural tradition that centered on the natural resources and environment. The changes brought about during the colonial period had significant impact on these societies and hence keeping in view about the unique traditions of each community, a number of policies have been adopted by the colonial government. This special recognition continues to the post-independence era and a number of plans have been designed and implemented for developmental purposes. The region has seen a long phase of social and political tension that has halted the economic development for a number of times. On this background

history of different societies of north-east India is important for reviews that are based on new insights, new data, new interpretations and new answers too.

Thus the aim of this seminar is to discuss historical developments in major issues which have been fundamental in the progress of northeast India and are currently of significant interest to researchers, social and political leaders of the region. The seminar will bring together specialists, including practitioners and academic experts of social sciences and humanities. The selected papers will be published in book form and made available for research and development of history writing on North-East India.

SUBMISSION OF FULL LENGTH PAPER:

The soft copies of the full length paper should not exceed 3000 words. It should be typed in APA format with 1.5 line spacing in Times New Roman, font size 12. Full paper should be submitted by November 5, 2018

HOW TO REACH:

To reach Kohima the nearest railways and airways hub is in Dimapur, which is approximately 70 kilometers from Kohima. From Dimapur, taxis, and cabs are easily available to reach Kohima. With all the neighbouring cities, and states like Guwahati, Imphal, Shillong and Dimapur, Kohima is well connected by roadways. Daily trains for

Guwahati, Kolkata, New Delhi and other major cities in the country are available from here. If planning to travel by airways in Nagaland then the closest airport is in Dimapur.. The driving distance between Kohima Bus Station and Don Bosco College is 4.7 km.

II. The audited head-wise statement of accounts and utilization certificate in GFR (Form 12A-copy enclosed) for the entire expenditure incurred from the sanctioned amount. Both these needs to be duly certified by the Chartered Accountant/Finance Officer (in case of Central University), Convener and the Head of the concerned institution/college/university.

The above documents are mandatory requirement to settle the account and enable us to release the final installment.


The other conditions are:



REPORT ON NATIONAL SEMINAR “HISTORICAL DEVELOPMENT IN NORTH-EAST INDIA: TRENDS AND PERSPECTIVES” SPONSORED BY INDIAN COUNCIL OF SOCIAL SCIENCE RESEARCH, NEW DELHI.
16th -17th NOVEMBER 2018

The Department of History, Don Bosco College organized a National Seminar on the theme, *“Historical Development in North-East India: Trends and Perspectives”*. The seminar was sponsored by *Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi*. It was a two day seminar held on 16th and 17th November, 2018. The Seminar was spearheaded by Dr. *Lanukumla Ao, Coordinator, Miss Vehutalu Vero, Assistant Coordinator and Miss Tsutshowe-ü Sekhamo, Assistant Coordinator.*

Prof. Dr. D. Gnanadurai, Vice Chancellor, St. Joseph University, Nagaland was invited as the special invitee for the inaugural programme. The inaugural session was chaired by *Dr. Lanukumla Ao*, coordinator of the seminar. The programme started with a prayer invoked by *Fr. James T. P., SDB* and welcome address was delivered by *Fr.
