## **REPORT ON CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME**

The Capacity Building Programme for faculty of Social Sciences was organised by Assam Don Bosco University, Tapesia Campus, Guwahati sponsored by ICSSR, New Delhi from 1<sup>st</sup> – 15<sup>th</sup> July, 2018, on the theme visible, vulnerable, viable and emerging conceptualization of epistemological believes and in road of development in north east in particular. The programme was coordinated by Dr. Dominic, Associate Professor, Assam Don Bosco University. There were 25 participants from Assam, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh and Nagaland. Three staffs from Don Bosco College Kohima, Jarani Mao, Tsuthsowe-ü Sekhamo and Kezienuo have attended the programme. The entire capacity building programme comprises of 45 sessions, excluding the Inauguration and Valedictory programme. The sessions were guided by ten (10) experts and eminent academicians.

On 2<sup>nd</sup> July, 2018, a pre-test was conduct to test the knowledge of the participants in research methodology. A written assignment was given on the topic of “Why Teaching and Research should go hand in hand?” which was submitted on 4<sup>th</sup> July, 2018. After days of tight and busy schedules, an outing day was allotted to the participants on 8<sup>th</sup> July, 2018. The team visited Kalashetra Museum to see the different cultures and traditions of the whole northeast in a beautifully setup single location. After which, the team proceed to IDBM (Don Bosco Institute, Guwahati) to have a good view of the brimming Brahmaputra river.

On 11<sup>th</sup> July, all the participants presented a paper on “Research Proposal”. The aim behind it was to allow the participants to write a good research proposal. On the following day i.e., 13<sup>th</sup> July, a post-test was conducted to test the knowledge of the participants from the sessions.

Inaugural Speech was delivered by Dr. Joshua Thomas, Coordinator, ASEAN Studies Centre (ASC) ICSSR-NERC and Valedictory address was delivered by Prof. David Syiemlieh, Former UPSC Chairman and give away the certificates to the participants.

The Capacity Building Programme was a productive and motivational event. It guided the participants for a better understanding of the Concepts, Philosophy, Theories, Methodology, Literature Reviews and Hypothesis, which are prerequisites for undertaking any research works.

## SEMINAR ON VIDEOGRAPHY AND PHOTOGRAPHY

Don Bosco College Kohima conducted a talk on videography and photography on 3<sup>rd</sup> of Aug, 2018, Friday, from 2:10 – 3:20 pm. Invited resource person was Fr. Jiji Kalavankal (Don Bosco Image, Institute of Media, Animation, Graphics and Effects), who was accompanied by eminent photographer Father Thomas. A total of 175 students of Don Bosco College attended the talk. Welcome address was given by the Principal, DBCK, Fr. Dr. P. Suresh and Felicitation by Dr. Adenuo Luikham (Eng. Dept. DBCK)

The talk was organised so that students can be equipped with the knowledge and skills that goes into videography and film-making. The talk was held as a part of the programme activity of the Movie Club of DBCK.

The speaker, Father Jiji Kalavankal, spoke on how an individual can start videography armed with the simplest gadgets. Having basic knowledge such as the right angles and continuity awareness can be crucial when making short-clips or longer films, and once equipped with these ideas, videography can be easily done even on ordinary mobile phones.

The speaker also talked about certain techniques to edit videos by using certain apps. He also added that when promoting a video, one should keep in mind to present it on the best display or projector.

Different short movies which were shot by the speaker were also shown. This was followed by a Q&A session. The programme was concluded with vote of thanks given by Grace Kath (3<sup>rd</sup> Semester, Eng. Honours).





## **Two Day Literary Workshop on Language Skills held at DBCK**

The Literary Society of Don Bosco College, Kohima organised a two-day Workshop on the 16<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup> of August 2018 on the topic 'Language and Writing Skills'. Altogether 70 students and teachers attended the Workshop. Dr. Imlienla Imchen, assistant professor, Centre for Tribal Languages and Studies, Nagaland University animated the participants on Phonetics, Organs of Speech and various Consonantal and Vowel Sounds. Imchen laid emphasis on the importance of the uniqueness of language which makes men different from other living beings. She identified the differences of sounds and tones uttered by the diverse tribes in our State as well as on the English we speak to those of the native English speakers. On writing skills, she illustrated on the mechanics of writing, the usage of proper punctuations and vocabulary. Dr. Toshimenla, assistant professor, DBCK delivered the welcome note and concluded with a proposal of vote of thanks by Dr. Adenuo Luikham, Assistant Professor, DBCK.

## Report on National Seminar

The Department of History, Don Bosco College organized a National Seminar on the theme, ***“Historical Development in North-East India: Trends and Perspectives”***. The seminar was sponsored by ***Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi***. It was a two day seminar held on 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> November, 2018. The Seminar was spearheaded by Dr. *Lanukumla Ao, Coordinator, Miss Vehutalu Vero, Assistant Coordinator and Miss Tsutshowe-ü Sekhamo, Assistant Coordinator.*

***Prof. Dr. D. Gnanadurai, Vice Chancellor, St. Joseph University, Nagaland*** was invited as the special invitee for the inaugural programme. The inaugural session was chaired by *Dr. Lanukumla Ao*, coordinator of the seminar. The programme started with a prayer invoked by *Fr. James T. P., SDB* and welcome address was delivered by *Fr. Dr. P. Suresh*, Principal of the college. Addressing the gathering, special invitee stressed that imparting education in social science must not be limited to class rooms alone. *Prof. N. He further urged the scholars not to neglect the traditional values imbedded in the cultural ethos of northeast. ## **Report on one-day seminar on Naga writers speak: 3<sup>rd</sup> series**

24 B.A. 2<sup>nd</sup> semester English honours students along with the HOD of the Department Mrs. Pinky Sagolsem attended one day seminar on Naga writers speak 3<sup>rd</sup> series organised by Department of English on 27<sup>th</sup> November, 2018 at Kohima College. The Chairperson for the programme was Theyiesenuo Keditsu Assistant Professor, Department of English, Kohima College. Welcome note was given by Moanungla Kevichusa, Associate Professor HOD, Department of English, Kohima College. It gave the opportunity to learn about Naga writers and Naga historical societies. The main objective of the seminar was to interact with Naga writers. It was a very enriching experience.

The speaker for the occasion was Dr. Easterine Kire. She is a poet, novelist, and writer of children's book. She is also the author of 'A terrible matriarchy', which talks about a young girl growing up in a traditional Naga society, was selected by the Government of India to be translated into six UNESCO languages. The speaker gave a presentation on setting of the book, the cultural, historical and political life of Naga during 60s and 70s. Dr. Easterine Kire stressed upon how historical society of Naga is a positive steps toward preservation of culture.

Taking in the context the writings of Lhutu Keyho, Dr. Emisenla Jamir, Dr. Avenuo Kire, the speaker elaborated upon their books and stated that Naga writings are essentially cultured by products. No culture is static and so is the case with Naga culture which is in fact dynamic and alive. Dr. Easterine Kire concluded by reminding the audience of the rich historical tradition of Nagas and emphasized upon the importance of critically looking into one's on culture.



## National Seminar at Don Bosco, Maram

On, 21<sup>st</sup> of February, We the Students of English Department were given the privilege to attend a talk on American Literature by Mauricio D. Aguilera Linde, in Mount Olive College, Kohima. The programme began by 11:00 am and the principal of the College introduced the invitee to all the students.

Mauricio D. Aguilera is a Teacher of American literature since 1992 till date. He is a Scholar, Editor, Publisher and Lecturer as well. He gave a talk about how the Native Americans spent their life, about history as well. He also said that the Native Americans existed on three pillars; they were (i) Genocide (ii) Slavery (iii) Historical Evolution. 'Silvacus' is a Latin word term from where savage is derived which at that time was referred to Native Americans. The invitee showed us two (2) Paintings and made us understand them, which referred to the suffering of the Native Americans.

And lastly, the invitee taught us about the Chief of Native Americans who for Pleasure, sexually harassed the white ladies.

**A brief report National Seminar on Ideals of the Indian Constitution and The Contemporary Challenges in Higher Education held on 27<sup>th</sup>-28<sup>th</sup> April at Don Bosco Institute, Guwahati**

With the objective to understand the framework of the Indian Constitution well and to delve deep into the contemporary challenges related to Higher Education. The Don Bosco Higher Education organized a National Seminar on the Ideals of the Indian Constitution and the Contemporary Challenges in Higher Education. It was a well organized seminar where lecturers from Don Bosco Colleges from across the state participated. **Miss Otolli.V.Yeptho and Dr Lanukumla, Asst professors** from the Department of English and History went as participants to this Seminar. The seminar began on **27<sup>th</sup> April** with an inaugural session with **Rev.Fr. Januarius Sangma sdb, Salesian Provincial, Guwahati Province** as the Chief Guest, the Introductory session was taken up by **Fr.Owen Chourappa SJ, Director LCHR, Guwahati** on the topic ***“Principles and Ideals of the Indian Constitution.”*** He began with Making of the Indian constitution: How it came into being, Resolution of the Constitution and different elements of the Indian constitution. One interesting catchphrase given by him in this session was ***“A Constitution works well if it is worked well”*** A good interactive session was done and many insights were given and gleaned by the participants. The second session was taken up by **Mr.Shangreiso Huiling, Advocate, High Court of Meghalaya.** The topic for the Session was ***“ The Indian Constitution and Independence of the Judiciary-Challenges”*** In this session insight was given on how to be a responsible citizen because if the hands of the citizen was not clean it disturbs the hand of the Judiciary. This session was also interesting and many questions were raised and discussed. After the session the participants went for a visit to Assam Don Bosco University. On the second day i.e. on **28<sup>th</sup> April**, The session was taken up by **Fr. Ravi Sagar SJ, Advocate, Supreme Court of India.** The topic of the session was ***“Religious Freedom and Modern Day Challenges against the backdrop of the Indian Constitution.”*** He in a very interesting and in a very articulate way presented and explained about the Constitution and its values, Freedom of Religion from Article 25- 30 omitting Article 29 was presented and discussed in a very clear and interesting way. Every participant benefitted from this session. After the session a discussion was done by dividing the Participants into groups and Action plan was made as to how to let the students understand about the ideals of the constitution which was followed by a Valedictory function which came to a close by singing of the National Anthem and reciting together of the Preamble of India.
