





A Talk on Writing Skills Date: 22nd August 2020





3 day workshop on Basic Online Teaching




On 28th August 2020, the Political Science Department of Don Bosco College Kohima conducted an 'Invited Talk' on the theme "National Education Policy and the Future of College Education in Nagaland." The resource person for the invited talk was Dr.KanatoChophy, New India Foundation Fellow, Bangaluru, India. He animated the students on the New Education Policy (NEP) approved by the Union cabinet on July 29, 2020 after a gap of 34 years. He highlighted the students that NEP will change the Pedagogy of the whole structure across the whole nation affecting both the government as well as private intuitions. He clearly elaborated the features and the characteristics of NEP, then challenged the students of political science department to make research study on digital democracy. Because a significant feature of NEP amongst many, allows a procedure to introduce decoding/digital starting from classes five and six. 


Department of Education, DBCK – Activity Report (3rd September 2020)






Activity- Orientation on Soft Skills, dated 26th September 2020




Faculty members of the department chaired/moderated each lecture. The Participants also gave good insights on the lectures.




Report: Rovers & Rangers Club Activity

Bosco Music Club (BMC) report DBCK


Date: 5th December 2020





LIBRARY ORIENTATION PROGRAMME

Dated: 22-02-2021

Library Orientation Programme for 1st Year Students Academic session 2020-21, was held on 22nd February, 2021 at Don Bosco College Kohima Library. Mr. N. Geetchandra Singh, the Librarian of DBCK took in-charge of the programme and he taught the students how to use and how to access the library resources. He highlighted the following library rules and regulations to the students:

- a) Library card with ID card is compulsory for entry to library.
- b) All the users must observe total silence in the library.
- c) All bags, cases, folders, etc. must be left at the property counter.
- d) Entry in the entry register is mandatory.
- e) Used of mobile phone is strictly prohibited.
- f) The library staffs have the right to ask the students to leave the library if they are behaving inappropriately or causing disturbance to other users.
- g) Show the books and other materials which being taken out of the library to the library staff.
- h) Books will be issued on presentation of the library card along with ID card.
- i) Library borrower cards are not transferable. The borrower is responsible for the book borrowed on his/her card.
- j) Students may borrow two books at a time for a period of 7 days and it can be renew two times.
- k) Books borrowed should be returned on or before the due date, if returned late overdue fine Rs. 2 per day will be charged.
- l) If book lost, the borrower shall replace the book of the same edition or latest edition with late fine.
- m) Marking, tampering, underlining, writing and tearing away the pages of the books are punishable with fine or replacement of the book or both.

He also taught how to search documents available in the library through OPAC. The programme was conducted for 15 minutes for each department. Total 174 students were present while 4 students were absent for the programme. Students' library borrower cards were also issued in the programme so they can use it to access the library resources.
