Our second day with fine art club also our last day in the village while the remaining activities are kept in hold due to pandemic till the further notice.

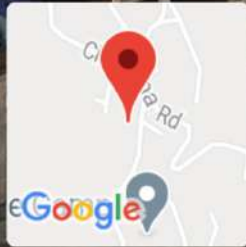

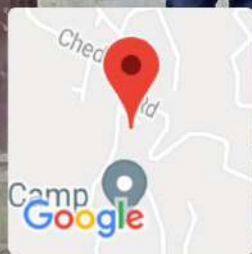
There was a good photography session and refreshments as well.
