
### REPORT ON ONLINE CERTIFICATE COURSE IN UNDERSTANDING PHONETICS AND PHONOLOGY OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE

The Department of English, Don Bosco College Kohima in collaboration with IQAC, DBCK, has offered an Online Certificate Course in Understanding Phonetics and Phonology of English Language for the 1st Semester Students from 1<sup>st</sup>-15<sup>th</sup> July, 2020. The initiative was taken with an objective to make the students aware of the sound system of English Language so as to improve their pronunciation. 179 students availed the course. During the course, one formative assessment test was conducted to monitor the student progress and provide feedback for improvement. A summative assessment test is conducted for a total of 100 marks, with 40 marks as the qualifying mark. Certificates are distributed to the students who successfully completed the course and met the qualifying marks.


The competition was truly a delightful experience for all the participants. The Department of History hopes to conduct more of this kind in the near future.




### Literary Club, Don Bosco College Kohima


# "Short story writing competition"




#### 26<sup>th</sup> September 2020


concluded. The judges of the programme were Dr. Toshi, Dr. Pinky, Dr. Adenuo and Dr. Velhou Koza.


### **Report on Inter-Collegiate Online Essay Writing Competition**






### REPORT IN CREATIVE WRITING



The two day activities with literary Club was quiet memorable with students, trainers, and teaching faculty of GMS, Chedema all happy and glad.

















### 26<sup>st</sup> November, 2020 – Spin a Yarn Session –PART I
