REPORT ON ONLINE CERTIFICATE COURSE IN UNDERSTANDING PHONETICS AND PHONOLOGY OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE

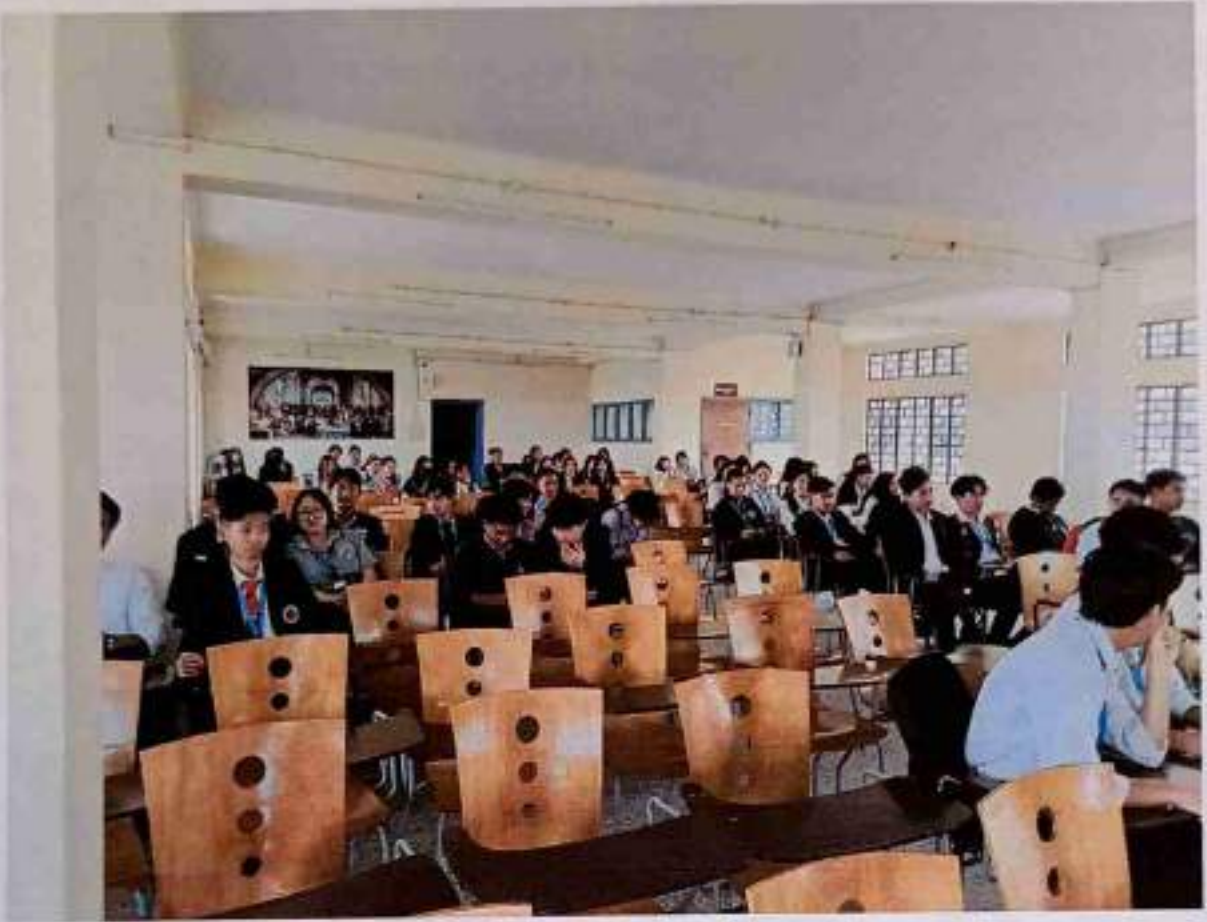
The Department of English, Don Bosco College Kohima in collaboration with IQAC, DBCK, has offered an Online Certificate Course in Understanding Phonetics and Phonology of English Language for the 1st Semester Students from 1st-15th July, 2020. The initiative was taken with an objective to make the students aware of the sound system of English Language so as to improve their pronunciation. 179 students availed the course. During the course, one formative assessment test was conducted to monitor the student progress and provide feedback for improvement. A summative assessment test is conducted for a total of 100 marks, with 40 marks as the qualifying mark. Certificates are distributed to the students who successfully completed the course and met the qualifying marks.
