
Rovers and Rangers 2020-2021




Report: Rovers & Rangers Club Activity

After the talk some students also put up questions which were clarified by the resource person. The program was a success as the members were able to gain more knowledge and also better understand the working process of the club.





Report: Rovers & Rangers Club Activity
