

Such as " How long will the covid-19 vaccine last in us, If we are half vaccinated or fully vaccinated? "



REPORT ON INTERVIEW BUILDING SESSION







Report on National Voters' Day 2022:





Report on Vermicomposting Workshop

Workshop on vermicompost was held on 3rd March 2022 for the 6th Semester students by Environmental Studies in collaboration with Bosco Green Allaince and department of Soil and Water Conservation Government of Nagaland. It was chaired by Ankita Priyadarshani, invocation by Hector, felicitation by Fr. Dr. P Suresh, talk by the resource person and vote of thanks by Micheal.

Mr. Ruokuosietuo Rokus Dist. Soil Conservation Officer Mokokchung was the resource person. He stressed on the importance of vermicomposting and how it helps in reducing environmental pollution. He also talked about the construction process, raw material for bedding, maintaining the moisture content and the right time for harvesting of the manures. And that the whole process takes about 2-3 months so we can produce sufficient amount of manures.

The Formal programme was followed by demonstration, where at the vermicomposting site he demonstrated about the filtering of the vermin from vermiwash and the vermicomposting bedding and structure.

Preamble:

A one day workshop on Human Rights (Child Related Acts and Laws) was conducted on 7th March 2022, at Don Bosco College Kohima, in order to spread human rights literacy among the youths of the college, and also to make them aware of the issues related with the subject of human rights. This workshop has been organized by the college in collaboration with Childline Kohima.

Participant's Profile:

DBCK students and faculty of the three departments: Commerce, Political Science and Psychology (Shift 2), respected Fr. Christu Das, members and resource persons (Childline Kohima).

Description about the program:

The interdepartmental workshop on Human Rights was chaired by Alinto Awomi (BA 2nd Semester, Pol. Sc. Dpt.). The program was graced by the presence of resource persons – Miss Pelezhanuo Elizabeth (Team Member of Childline Kohima) and Miss Asen Walling (Advocate Gauhati High Court/ Kohima Bench and Panel Lawyer/ Kohima District Legal Services Authority). Respected Fr. Christu Das (Director, Bosco Computer Centre) invoked blessings upon the program, Miss Nutsolu Swuro (Asst. Professor, Pol. Sc. Dpt.) and Miss Sharon Khing (Asst. Professor, Comm. Dpt.) also participated in the program as representatives of the college.

Miss Nutsolu Swuro welcomed the resource persons and gave a brief sum up of their occupations to the participants.

Miss Pelezhanuo Elizabeth, participated and spoke on the topic: Introduction of CHILDLINE. In her speech, she introduced childline services, in particular CHILDLINE 1098, and emphasized the atrocities inflicted upon the children of the nation, in general, and state, in particular, whilst also elaborating the role of CHILDLINE 1098 in helping and protecting them.

Miss Asen Walling, spoke on the topic: Human Rights (Child Related Acts and Laws). She discussed on a wide array of human rights, connecting them with child rights. Some notable acts and laws mentioned were :-Right to Education (RTE) Act, 2009; Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection) Act, 2015; Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POSCO) Act, 2012. She also encouraged the participants to utilize their powers and promote awareness and help, and to lead as an example for the advancing generations.

Feedback:



Future Perspectives:



SEMINAR REPORT: Revisiting History, Culture and Traditions of Nagas


The Department of History, Don Bosco College Kohima sent two participants to present a paper in a State Level Inter-College Student's Seminar organized by the Department of History, Modern College, Kohima on the theme *Revisiting History, Culture and Traditions of Nagas,* dated: $21^{st} - 22^{nd}$ April, 2022 and sponsored by the Department of Art and Culture, Government of Nagaland. The objective for participation was to make the students undertake more research work and to encourage the young minds to explore the hidden history and culture of the Nagas. The department also intent to provide a platform to students for growth.

Students (both PG and UG) from different colleges in Nagaland were invited to present the papers. Miss KJ Musushe and Miss Vikeduonuo Dzeyie, Department of History, DBCK, 6th Semester, presented a join paper titled, *Naga Material Culture and Identity: A Probe*.
