Topic - Classroom Management and Counseling Techniques in handling Students

Human Resource Development Committee, Don Bosco College, Kohima organised its first offline Staff Development Program after the pandemic. The programme was chaired by Mrs.ani Mao, Coordinator of IQAC. The session started with the blessings of God between us by Ms. Razoukhrienuo (Asst. Prof Dept of Sociology and welcome note was given by Fr. Christudass sdb Director Bosco Compute Centre, DBCK. It was attended by all the teaching staff of DBCK.

The session started with the introduction of Classroom management Techniques and understanding our students in the best possible way. Practicing patience with rational detachment to set effective limits and also to keep a schedule of our teaching so that we are at all times prepared. We were made aware of the causes of certain behaviour in a student and to engage with them so that they can open up to us and we can find the possible causes as well as address the bad behaviour quickly. The rise of Problematic Students Behaviour not only in the classroom but also in the society at large becoming as issue for all educators were taught to deal with patience and rationalism. Simple things that causes distress in a student were asked to be dealt with mindful precipitation.

Following on our own expectations is the key to modeling timeless and productivity. The more organized we are, The more opportunity there is to focus on teaching and learning which would also help the students respect schedules and work within designated time frames. As a General Rule, Consistency is very important, it was also advised to get feedback from students regarding our teaching and approach towards them and also to double check students perceptions on us.

The second session was about Counselling technique in Handling Students where our resource person emphasised mainly on Mentor sessions in educational institutions. The importance of Mentors towards Mentees was mainly build on understanding the students as an individual and building rapport or communication. We were asked to keep in mind of how we respond to a student in distress and Para verbal communication. We were asked to keep in mind of how we respond to a student in distress and to encourage in positive self emphasizing on the question 'What is it about and how can I help?'

Inattentive, rowdy or challenging students who also distracts others when we are teaching are to be encouraged with asking questions and using names and also by friendly eye contact. We must keep in mind that sometimes disruption is just misguided energy that simply needs to be invited into the conversation. Setting effective limits, review and posting classroom expectations is important so that the vision of expectation are clearly visible to the students.
