The 6th Semester performed on a *Sumi* folklore. The drama depicts a classical story of love at first sight and the important customs observed by the *Sumi* tribe. The drama illustrates the importance of adhering to certain rituals and omens that played pivotal role in determining the fate of auspicious ceremonies.

Love story of *Pheou* and *Nishili* – a *Sumi* folktale was presented by the 4th Semester. The play conveys that people with good behaviour and personality are appreciated.

An *Angami* folktale, *Morusa* and *Mehouvi-ü* was performed by the 2nd Semester. The drama convey the message on the dangerous and ruthless practice of headhunting. It also convey the message about the braveness of the forefathers.

The 6th Semester students were declared the winner followed by the 4th and 2nd Semester students in the first and second position.

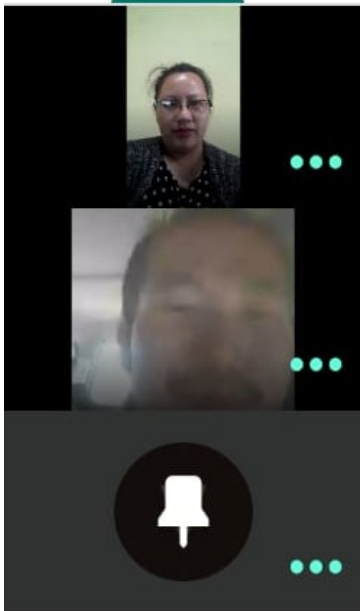
Report of the Activity: 28/08/2020
