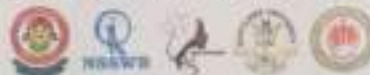

AWARENESS PROGRAMME TO CHEDEMA

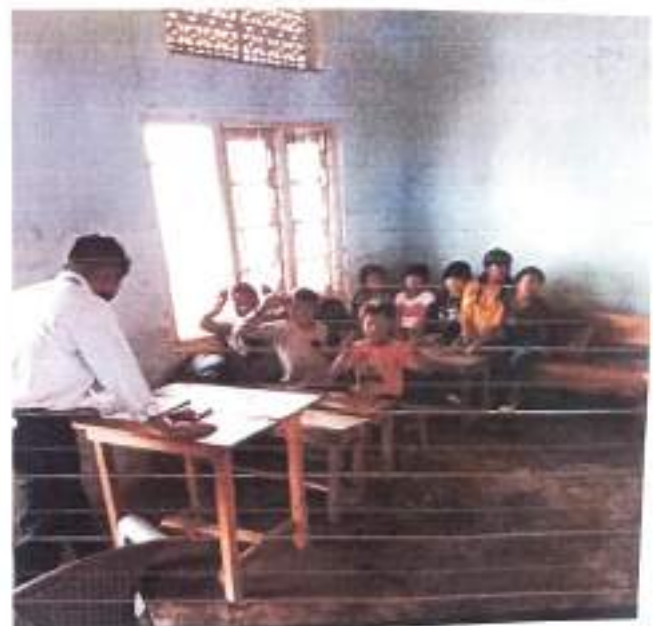
