A sacred wild pear tree known as “*Chitebu Kajii*”. The tree is believed to have been planted at the time of migration of the Nagas to different areas.

A sacred Banyan tree called “*Marabu*”, considered a magical tree by the locales is believed to have seven stages and each branch signifies different seasons.

We had a wonderful time and learned many significant things from the trip. This type of educational field trip must be encouraged in the near future.

3. Political Science Department: Viswema Village.

The group had witness various important sites of the village such as the Banyan tree, Naga Pearl tree, Khubu Ridzii, Ora tobu tu and Pinoumai 3 Kosii Tamara tu. essential for the dispersal of the people into various ways. The group after visiting the important sites and collecting the data, returned back to Kohima.

1st – 15th July, 2018: CAPACITY BUILDING PROGRAMME

The Capacity Building Programme for faculty of Social Sciences was organised by Assam Don Bosco University, Tapesia Campus, Guwahati sponsored by ICSSR, New Delhi from 1st – 15th July, 2018, on the theme visible, vulnerable, viable and emerging conceptualization of epistemological believes and in road of development in north east in particular. The Capacity Building Programme was a productive and motivational event. It guided the participants for a better understanding of the Concepts, Philosophy, Theories, Methodology, Literature Reviews and Hypothesis, which are prerequisites for undertaking any research works.

The Compassion Channel is an initiative started by Dr. Kiyasetuo Stephen Vizo to create a platform for NSS volunteers to 'earn while learning' and give them the opportunity to give back to the NSS' adopted village, Chedema.

The programme started with a Bible reading by Mr. Njihyun and invocation by Ms. Zubeni. The principal DBCK delivered the welcome note and later Mrs. Pinky Sagolsem, NSS programme officer, felicitated the chief guest. This was followed by presentation of the

proposed activities to be carried out as part of the Compassion Channel by NSS volunteers (individual and groups).

The chief guest in his speech highlighted how the idea of compassion channel came to him on hearing about the activities of the NSS club. The compassion channel is to encourage and to motivate college students to take up compassionate activities or charity works targeting the needy and the downtrodden section of the society through the mission, “earning while learning for compassionate works” and the slogan “Giving better than taking”. The channel is to inculcate the students not to burden their parents in doing any compassionate venture. It is to reverse the present practice of simply taking the hard earned, say money, of their parents and giving to the needy as a gesture of charity, to expectedly more satisfying ways of helping someone through the earnings of oneself with the sweat of one brows.

The compassion channel is to function, initially; with a seed money of Rs. 1,00,000 which is to be given to the college students either individuals or group of students from amongst those registered NSS volunteers. The seed money determined and regulated by a board. The seed money is to be returned to the compassion channel management board just before the Annual NSS special camp. The students are allowed to utilize the fund generated for compassionate works during the NSS special camp. The compassion channel is a “win-win channel” for both the needy and the students. It opens a Nobel channel not only to help the needy in a most meaningful and practicable manner with active involvement of students in lawful income generating activities but also likely to have a lifelong positive impact on the life of the students in doing more compassionate works for years to come.

The speech was followed by money hand-over for the proposed activities. The programme concluded with a vote of thanks given by Dr. Adenuo Luikham, NSS co-ordinator. The programme was chaired by Mr. Evitsu.

17th September 2018: Staff Orientation Programme

The Chairperson for the programme was Theyiesenuo Keditso Assistant Professor, Department of English, Kohima College. Welcome note was given by Moanungla Kevichusa, Associate Professor HOD, Department of English, Kohima College. It gave the opportunity to learn about Naga writers and Naga historical societies. The main objective of the seminar was to interact with Naga writers. It was a very enriching experience.

The speaker for the occasion was Dr. Easterine Kire. She is a poet, novelist, and writer of children's book. She is also the author of 'A terrible matriarchy', which talks about a young girl growing up in a traditional Naga society, was selected by the Government of India to be translated into six UNESCO languages. The speaker gave a presentation on setting of the book, the cultural, historical and political life of Naga during 60s and 70s. Dr. Easterine Kire stressed upon how historical society of Naga is a positive steps toward preservation of culture.

Taking in the context the writings of Lhutu Keyho, Dr. Emisenla Jamir, Dr. Avenuo Kire, the speaker elaborated upon their books and stated that Naga writings are essentially cultured by products. No culture is static and so is the case with Naga culture which is in fact dynamic and alive. Dr. Easterine Kire concluded by reminding the audience of the rich historical tradition of Nagas and emphasized upon the importance of critically looking into one's own culture.

On 15th- Day 7: After breakfast the group visited Thiruvananthapuram, palace, Covalam Beach, Churches, forest and island trip by boat and padma swami temple and returned to Kanyakumari.

On 16th and 17th- Day 8 & 9: At 05.20 pm, the team departed to Chennai by train and reached Chennai on 17th at 06.25 am. The team made a tour to Chennai City – Marina Beach, Snake Park, Govt. Museum & Commercial Area. After Dinner, at 22.30 pm, we departed for Guwahati.

On 20th December, the tour team reached Dimapur at 01:30 pm, from where all the team dispersed for their own respective destination.

The tour was overall a successful and a thrilling experience for all the team, providing ample opportunities to explore and learned about the rich cultures existing in the other and different side of our country which varies from the North-Eastern state cultures. The students also got an opportunity to learn and experience valuable firsthand knowledge

practically by being an active participant. The Tour will enhance their learning directly or indirectly not only at present but also for future endeavors.

2. English: Sikkim

19 students from the Department of English along with the teacher-in-charge Dr. Adenuo S. Luikham and her sister, Shonron Luikham, went for an educational tour to Sikkim, a state renowned for its high efficiency in government administration and scenic landscape, from Dec 11-16, 2018. The educational tour group visited many landmark tourist sites as well as historical sites in and around Gangtok, the capital of Sikkim.

Day 1 (Dec 11):

The group departed for Sikkim on the 11th of December, 2018 from Dimapur Railway station for NJP station in West Bengal.

Day 2 (Dec 12):

The train arrived at NJP station around 6:15 AM. On arriving, the students were given time to freshen up at a waiting room after which the group proceeded for breakfast at a nearby hotel. The journey to Gangtok started around 8:15 AM and it took five hours to reach Gangtok. On reaching Gangtok, the students as well as the teacher-in-charge were put up in the Yalung Retreat which is a hotel situated in the heart of the city. After resting and allocation of the rooms, the students were allowed to go sightseeing and marketing in MG marg which is the main shopping and commercial hub of Gangtok. The day ended with dinner at 7:30 PM.

Day 3 (Dec 13):

After breakfast the students were taken to several historical and tourist sites in and around Gangtok. First, they visited Ganesh Tok, a strategic viewpoint which offered a great view of the mountain range surrounding Gangtok. Pictures were taken wearing traditional attires.

Second, a plant conservatory was visited where the students were able to study and see the botanical richness of the state of Sikkim. The conservatory also offered a fantastic view of the snow-clad mountains of Sikkim.

Third, the students visited Tashi viewpoint and a nearby Buddhist monastery.

After that, the students visited a flower exhibition where they got to see the different varieties of orchids that Sikkim is well-known for.

The day ended with a cable-rope ride that gave the students an opportunity to witness Gangtok from a bird's eye view.

Day 4 (Dec 14):

The highlight of the day was visiting the famous lake Tsango which lies at an altitude of 12,000 feet. The students also had a thrilling experience going for yak rides, playing in the snow and going for a boat ride in Hangu resort.

They also visited a historical place called Baba Mandir.

In the evening, the students went for marketing and were given personal shopping time.

Day 5 (Dec 15):

After brunch, the educational tour group headed out from the hotel at around 10 AM to commence their journey home. It took five hours to reach NJP station and the train to Dimapur left the station at around 7:00 PM.

Day 6 (Dec 16):

The study tour group reached Dimapur at 1:00 PM in the afternoon.

The educational tour to Sikkim was an enriching experience for the 6th Semester students of the English Department of Don Bosco College, Kohima. Not only were the students able to see a different culture but also experience many new and exciting things on this trip. The trip was also important as the students can contextualize the setting of Kiran Desai's novel "The Inheritance of Loss" which is part of their syllabus this semester. Overall, it was a fulfilling trip with many memories to take home.

3. History: Kolkata, Bhusaval, Mumbai and Goa

The department of history, Don Bosco College, Kohima, conducted an educational tour on 7th of December 2018. The total number of participants was 34 students from VI & IV Semester along with two Assistant professors and a tour guide. The group visited Kolkata, Bhusaval, Mumbai and Goa.

At Kolkata – The city of Joy, the place visited were the India Museum also referred as the Imperial Museum, which is the largest and oldest museum in India and has rare collections of antiques, armour and ornaments, fossil, skeletons, mummies, and Mughal paintings. It was founded by the Asiatic society of Bengal in Kolkata (Calcutta), India, in 1814. We also visited the Birla Planetarium the largest planetarium in Asia and the second largest in the world. The planetarium also has an astronomical observatory equipped with the latest technology. The Victoria memorial dedicated to memory of Queen Victoria (1819-1901) and is now a museum and tourist destination under the auspices of the ministry of culture. We also visited the Missionaries of charity's mother house. It was established by the blessed Mother Teresa in 1950.

Ajanta and Ellora Caves, in the Aurangabad district of Maharashtra, was our next destination. Ajanta was the first Buddhist cave monuments that date from the 2nd and 1st centuries B.C. The Paintings and sculptures of Ajanta are considered as the masterpiece of Buddhist religious art. Ellora Cave is one of the largest rock-cut monastery-temple cave complexes in the world, and a UNESCO world Heritage site, featuring Buddhist, Hindu and Jain monuments, and artwork, dating from the 600-1000 CE period.

Mumbai was our third destination wherein we visited Gateway of India which is an arch monument built during the 20th century in Bombay, India. Then we visited the Elephanta Cave located on Elephanta Island, in Mumbai Harbour. It is a UNESCO world heritage site and a collection of cave temples predominantly dedicated to the Hindu God Shiva. We also visited many other important sites here.

At Goa, we visited the Se Cathedral De Santa Catarina known as Se Cathedral, the Cathedral of the Latin Rite Roman Catholic Arch diocese of Goa and Daman and the seat of the seat of Patriarch of the East Indies. It is located in Old Goa. We also visited the Portuguese Royal house, Coupe of Beaches, Archaeological Survey of India Museums, experienced water boats, visited many other historical sites.

After a fruitful and memorable tour the group reached Dimapur railway station on 22nd of December, 2018 and with it the tour came to an end.

4. Political Science: Mumbai, Kolkata, Goa and Cochin

The students' of Political Science Department (6th semester), Don Bosco College, Kohima, embark on an educational tour to four famous and historical places in India viz., Mumbai, Kolkata, Goa and Cochin from 7th Dec-20th Dec 2018 as part of exposure and broadening our knowledge. The educational tour was an enriching one from the student's perspective wherein, we get to learn various cultures, traditions, way of living, etc. It was indeed a memorable trip filled with lots of love, laughter, fun and a new experiences.

5. Sociology: Agra, Jaipur, jaisalmer and Delhi

For the Northeast selection among the 16 students myself and one student .i.e. Ruvikho from Mount Olive College, we were selected at the northeast level. When I heard that I have been selected I couldn't believe it myself since I felt like I was the worst among all my other friends.

When I have to go for National level I didn't give much importance to it but since I was selected I just went with it. But after the one month training I understood what this camp meant for us and also realised that competition was not easy.

In this camp people from different states all over India came for the RD camp. 20 P.O from different regions, 200 NSS volunteers (100 boys and 100 females) including 178 colleges attended the camp. In a day we usually have 2 practises which followed by educational session and cultural programme in evening. During the training we were trained like the military forces where the training was so tough we go through many challenges and hardship. After 4 to 5 days of training the selection process started. In the first selection when I was not selected, felt as like I was kicked out from the whole competition so I cried bitterly and was about to lose hope, but this thought "I can do it" struck me, and so I started praying my rosary, I asked Mother Mary to help me through all the competition. Even my parents were praying and fasting for me because through prayer everything is possible. The next day I woke up early when no other woke up, I went in front of the mirror and practise it for around 30 minutes and on that very day I was selected. The moment I was being selected I was so happy that I started to put more efforts and hard work in everything I did.

We had around 7 rounds in selection process where I was been selected till the final selection round. Among 200 volunteers only 160 were selected to March on Rajpath on 26th of January 2019, I should say it was all because of the prayers that I was able to go through all the tough training and competitions.

On the great day .i.e. Republic Day, Marching on Rajpath with all the different military forces was like a dream. We March till India Gate and it took 4 km. there were thousands and thousands of people from various places came and watched us. It was a proud moment for me too since I represent our college as well as our State. Behind all this there were lots of things which words cannot express.

After Republic Day we went to different places for visiting important people and places. On 25th all those volunteers who were not selected for the RD went and met the Prime Minister Narendra Modi. On 27th we went and met our Honourable President of India Ram Nath Govin. On 28th we met the Vice President Venkaiah Naidu. On 29th we went and visited the Taj Mahal at Agra and on 30th we visited the Lotus Temple and on that evening we had the valedictory programmes, where certificates were distributed at all the volunteers.

On 31st morning we started our Journey back home, on 3rd of February, the Assam Governor felicitated us. It was such an honour to meet the Governor of Assam Jagdish Mukhi. We had an interaction session with him which was followed by photo session and refreshment.

Mauricio D. Aguilera is a Teacher of American literature since 1992 till date. He is a Scholar, Editor, Publisher and Lecturer as well. Aguilera Linda concluded by saying that American Literature has produced some of the most significant Prose and Poetry the world has seen. It contains most available knowledge and about its people. The belief, perception, philosophies-these are subtle place in the Literature the programme ended at 1:00 pm. 27th-28th April, 2019: National Seminar on Ideals of the Indian Constitution and The Contemporary Challenges in Higher Education held on 27TH-28TH April at Don Bosco Institute, Gauwahati

With the objective to understand the framework of the Indian Constitution well and to delve deep into the contemporary challenges related to Higher Education. The Don Bosco Higher Education organized a National Seminar on the Ideals of the Indian Constitution and the Contemporary Challenges in Higher Education. It was a well organized seminar where lecturers from Don Bosco Colleges from across the state participated. **Miss Otoliv. V. Yephtho and Dr Lanukumla**, Asst professors from the Department of English and History went as participants to this Seminar. The seminar began on **27th April** with an inaugural session with **Rev. Fr. Januarius Sangma sdb**, Salesian Provincial, Guwahati Province as the Chief Guest, the Introductory session was taken up by **Fr. Owen Chourappa SJ, Director LCHR, Guwahati** on the topic “*Principles and Ideals of the Indian Constitution.*” He began with Making of the Indian constitution: How it came into being, Resolution of the Constitution and different elements of the Indian constitution. One interesting catchphrase given by him in this session was “*A Constitution works well if it is worked well*” A good interactive session was done and many insights were given and gleaned by the participants. The second session was taken up by **Mr. Shangreiso Huilding, Advocate, High Court of Meghalaya.** The topic for the Session was “*The Indian Constitution and Independence of the Judiciary-Challenges*” In this session insight was given on how to be a responsible citizen because if the hands of the citizen was not clean it disturbs the hand of the Judiciary. This session was also interesting and many questions were raised and discussed. After the session the participants went for a visit to Assam Don Bosco University. On the second day i.e. on 28th April, The session was taken up by **Fr. Ravi Sagar SJ, Advocate, Supreme Court of India.** The topic of the session was “*Religious Freedom and Modern Day Challenges against the backdrop of the Indian Constitution.*” He in a very interesting and in a very articulate way presented and explained about the Constitution and its values, Freedom of Religion from Article 25- 30 omitting Article 29 was presented and discussed in a very clear and interesting way. Every participant benefitted from this session. After the session a discussion was done by dividing the Participants into groups and Action plan was made as to how to let the students understand about the ideals of the constitution which was followed by a Valedictory function which came to a close by singing of the National Anthem and reciting together of the Preamble of India.

1st May-7th May, 2019: NSS Special Camp.

Day 1: 01/05/19

On the first day of the Camp i.e. 1st May 2019, 28 NSS volunteers arrived at Chedema Village at 2.00 pm along with Dr.Velhou and Sir George. Along with two Brothers Mr. Bismal and Mr. George.

Demonstrations were done on:

- Emergency Method Rescue
- Big Arm and Small Arm
- Rescue crew
- Pull land trick
- Elevate.

The programme concluded at 4:15 pm and Blood donation campaign began at4:50 pm, the volunteers were divided into three groups and they went to different areas spreading awareness and importance about Blood donation.

Day 3: 03/05/19

The third day also began with the same routine of doing Physical exercise with Sir Lawrence. After the fitness activity, each group of NSS volunteers were assigned different responsibilities. At 10:0 am, the volunteers moved out for cleaning of Wells and Monuments along with the members of Chedema Students Union. 10th May, 2019: One Day Consultancy Programme

Altogether, 12 faculties from the mentioned three colleges attended the programme.

The session started at 10:00 AM. The programme was chaired by Dr. Seyiekhrielie Whiso, IQAC Coordinator, Kohima Science College, Jotsoma. Mr. Vimhakhhol Mekro, Vice Principal, gave the key note address. Dr. Sanjay Sharma, Asst. Professor, Department of Physics, highlighted on the process of NAAC Assessment basing on the NAAC seven criteria followed by an open discussion on clarification of doubts and queries by the participation.

After the formal session, the participating teams toured different offices and departments of Kohima Science College, Jotsoma.
