10-05-2019: One Day Consultancy Programme:

The DBCK, IQAC members attended a One Day Consultancy on NAAC Assessment and Accreditation organised by Kohima Science College, Jotsoma, Sponsored by Department of Higher Education on 10th May 2019. Different colleges participated in the programs, such as, Capital College Kohima, Don Bosco College Kohima, St. Xavier College Jalukie. Altogether, 12 faculties from the mentioned three colleges attended the programme.

The session started at 10:00 AM. The programme was chaired by Dr. Seyiekhrielie Whiso, IQAC Coordinator, Kohima Science College, Jotsoma. Mr. Vimhakhhol Mekro, Vice Principal, gave the key note address. Dr. Sanjay Sharma, Asst. Professor, Department of Physics, highlighted on the process of NAAC Assessment basing on the NAAC seven criteria followed by an open discussion on clarification of doubts and queries by the participation. After the formal session, the participating teams toured different offices and departments of Kohima Science College, Jotsoma. Over all, the programme was very much informative and purposeful in matters of the institutions preparing for NAAC assessment for the first cycle.

She also talked about how to help a child in need. If we come across a domestic worker who were illegally abused or in need, we should call **1098** immediately. The child line, Kohima is there 25x7 to help and render their service and shelter to children in need.

The program has started on 10th June 17, 2019 and will go on till 16th June 17, 2019 all over North-East. As in our college, it was started at 10:00 a.m. and ended by 11:10a.m.

14-06-2019: Meeting of Canteen Committee:

Block Kohima on the theme; “Unity is our goal: a just wage is our right: marching on to empower Domestic Workers”. There were more than 20 domestic workers who attended the workshop and the people from media; Nagaland Post and North Police Department also came to witness the program. There were various cultural dances from Kachari, Nepali and others to entertain the audience. Cerena Keduokhonuo Belho Women Helpline was the moderator and Abel Lotha Catechist SFS church invoked God’s blessing for the program.

Miss Avile, assistant labour Commissioner Director Kohima gave an exhortation speech about the domestic workers and their demand for wages and social security and she said if they unite and work together as one, they might fulfil their demand. Keynote speaker, Yanbemo Humtsoe, the SDPO spoke about the positive effects of domestic workers in the

house; because of them, the family lives peacefully and in harmony. They do the household works. He says that the workers should not be discouraged because they play an important role in the society. The workers should also work with honesty and integrity so that their masters would be happy with their work and even raise their wages.

The moderator summarized the speaker's speech at the final session and vote of thanks was given by Sedenuo Chüzho (FDWA staff). The session was over by 12:30 pm and there was a photo session at 1:00 pm.

15 to 17-06-2019: Mentoring classes for 1st, 3rd and 5th Semester:

The second mentoring session for the year 2019 was conducted in the month of June and July. The schedule followed for the mentoring session was given below:

Mentoring for 1st Semester Students (15th -17th June): The respective mentors were given 17 mentees each. Since it was their first time with their mentor they did not open up much. They were told to fill up the mentoring book and submit it to their respective mentor on time.

Mentoring for 3rd Semester Students was supposed to be from 18th - 20th June but it was continued till the 24th of June. It was because most of the 3rd semester students were participating and helping in the preparation of the Fresher's Party which was conducted on 21st of June.

The same was the case for the Mentoring for 5th Semester Students. The schedule for mentoring for the 5th semester was from 24th- 26th June but because of some programme in the college the students were busy. So the mentoring continued till 3rd of July. 17 to 19-06-2019: Library Orientation Programme:

Three day Library Orientation Programme was held at Don Bosco College Kohima Library. Mr. N. Geetchandra Singh, the Librarian of DBCK was the in charge of the programme. He taught the students how to use the library resources, how to search the books through OPAC, and how to keep the books at the right place. The programme lasted for 30 minutes for each department, semester-wise. On first day, around 137 students from 1st semester attended the programme. The next day was 3rd semester students and around 150 students from all departments were present. On last day only 16 students from 5th semester, English department attended the programme. During the programme some Library Rules and Regulation were also highlighted to the students.

The Library rules and regulations are:

1. Library card with ID card is compulsory for getting the library.
2. All the users must observe total silence in the library.
3. All bags, cases, folders, etc. must be left at the property counter.
4. Entry in the entry register is mandatory.
5. Used of mobile phone is strictly prohibited.
6. The library staffs have the right to ask the students to leave the library if they are behaving in appropriately or causing disturbance to other users.
7. Show the books and other materials which being taken out of the library to the library staff.
8. Books will be issued on presentation of the library card along with ID card.
9. Library borrower cards are not transferable. The borrower is responsible for the book borrowed on his/her card.
10. Students may borrow two books at a time for a period of 7 days and it can be Renew two times.
11. Books borrowed should be returned on or before the due date, if returned late overdue fine Rs. 2 per day will be charged.
13. If book lost, the borrower shall replace the book of the same edition or latest edition with late fine.
14. Marking, tampering, underlining, writing and tearing away the pages of the books are punishable with fine or replacement of the book or both.

21-06-2019: International Yoga Day:

State level 5th international yoga day was observed at 93 BN BSF Chedema, Kohima on Friday. The 93 BN BSF Chedema invited the NSS volunteers of Don Bosco College Kohima. All together 21 volunteers attended the program. The session was attended by Shri Surinder Singh commandant and 50 BSF Jawans along with their family members of 93 BN BSF Chedema. The yoga instructor of the day was BS Jawan who instructs more than 5 to 6 yoga poses along with its health benefits. 17-07-2019: How to access NDLI Resources;

I have taken 30 minutes class for each semester about National Digital Library resources in Hall-8 and Hall-9 separately. I taught them how to access National Digital Library India (NDLI) Resources and its importance. First I collected all the students and staffs E-mail IDs and registered it to NDL. After registered a mail came from NDLI, which content their Log-In IDs and Passwords. This email ID and password is compulsory to activate for accessing the resources.

As of April 2019, NDLI hosts 25,000,000+ items in its repository. These resources are freely available resources which can be accessed anywhere, anytime. The resources are stored in subject wise manner (e.g. Computer science, Philosophy and psychology, Religion, Social sciences, Language, Natural sciences and Mathematics, Technology, etc.), resource type (e.g. Book, Question paper, Article, Video lecture, Audio lecture, Thesis) and some featured sources also there.

For a small library it is not possible to provide all the books, documents or resources. So it is very important to register in NDLI for accessing such kind of resources.

20-07-2019: DEPARTMENTAL FIELD TRIP REPORT

1. Education: Trip to Khonoma Village:

Department of Education, Don Bosco College, Kohima conducted a field trip to Khonoma as a part of academic departmental activity on 20th of July 2019. The purpose of the trip was to enable the students to experience the practices of preserving nature and cultural heritage through traditional method. Altogether 79 students from 3 semesters, (I, III, V semester), along with three teachers participated in the trip.

The team reached Khonoma village at 10:30 A.M, whereby after registration, the team was led by a local guide, Mr. Vikho. The team was toured to different forts, monuments and morungs of various Clans/Khel in the village. After the visit, the students interacted with the guide regarding the practices of morung customs, agricultural practices, museum, village administration, educational status, religion practices and tourism.

All the students participated actively throughout the trip, and the direct observation of natural heritage and culture of Khonoma village, which was indeed the original culture of all the Naga's forefathers have been an exciting learning experience for all of them.

2. English Department: Trip to Tuophema Village:

Don Bosco College, Kohima, English Department, 77 students along with the assistant professors of English Department, Dr.Toshimenla and Miss Shürhonuo visited 'Tuophema Tourist Village' on 20 July, 2019. The trip began with lot of enthusiasm and vigour. We reached the location at 11:15 A.M. 'Touphema Tourist village' is an extraordinary place to explore and learn. It gives a true taste of Naga Village life. It is Located 41 km away from the

main town of Kohima. This place has 12 fascinating cottages, which was built by the twelve Angami clans or khels from Tuophema. Each entrance of the cottages have the traditional Naga symbols like Mithun (animal), Dao (sword), Jathi (spear), cup (for prosperity) etc. It has a traditionally styled Naga hut kitchen, which has a typical Naga traditional hearth, smoked meat, which has been there for more than 9-10years, some dried local herbs, dried corns, and various types of Naga a basket, which takes us back in time and which help us experience traditional Naga life. We also visited a museum inside the village which offers an extensive ethnographic collection Including pounding table containing paddy, depicting various stages of pounding rice, varieties of pots viz. Khubanü, Khrebo, Likhu, Liiki, etc., prestigious Jewels Such as Cornelia, Coral, Agate and Beats, Shawls worn by females, the peculiar yarn design on the female grave (as an animist), ornaments worn by both male and female, earthen jar for local brew, community bed made out of a solid trunk of a giant tree, the Angami shield made out of animal skin and a couple spears, equipment for spinning, bird trap, cross bow and prosperity stones, wood and bone sculptures, Naga suitcase with cover, wooden log Drum inscribed of Skulls and snakes, 1936 log Drum made of bronze, chairs made out of buffalo horn and elephant Bones, Naga made muzzle loading guns and rifles, etc. The museum has also displayed some belongings and photograph of 'Guolhoulie Rio Angami', the first village council chairman, and some dress belonging to "Dr. A.Z. Phizo' of Khonoma village. He is known as the "Father of the Nation" by the Nagas. The museum has an extensive collection of artifacts. We also visited the oldest house in the village and have witnessed a stone memorial which has been set up outside the house, which talks about a person called "Kense-e" and his clans who started Tuophema village and about how they settled there in the year 1431. They setup the Memorial stone on 12.2.2009. The Kense clan has reached 11 generation and the population is 1510 and 281 household. The memorial stone was setup in the name of "Kekhrieneilie" which was dedicated by Shri Neiphiu Rio.

The pictorial views of the surrounding hills and an authentic village provides an insight into the Naga ethnicity. It also tells the importance of preserving ancient cultures. On the whole it was an enriching learning experience for us. We departed from the place at 2 P.M.

3. History Department: Trip to Willong Village, Senapati District:

The Department of History, Don Bosco College Kohima conducted a field trip on 20th July 2019 to Willong village in Senapati district, Manipur. Willong is a historic village known for valour, scenic beauty and ancient relics. The site is also known as the Stonehenge of India.

The staff of the Department of History namely Dr. Lanukumla Ao, Miss Tsutshoweü Sekhamo and Mr. S. Lokho Anthony assistant professors along with 94 students participated in the field trip. We started the journey at around 6 am from Kohima. We stopped at Tadubi for lunch and headed for Maram. There we stopped at Don Bosco College, Maram and met the Principal Rev. Fr. K.O. Sabastian. He took us around the college and showed us the auditorium, one of the largest in Manipur.

After that we headed for Willong and reached the spot at around 10:40 a.m. There we contacted a retired teacher Sir Anthony from the village and took us a detour of the village. He took us to the place where monoliths were erected in ancient times. He explained and enlightened the group the reasons, purpose and the people who erected the monoliths. There are more than 100 monoliths erected since time immemorial by people with supernatural powers. The married men performed certain rituals to erect the monuments. To this day no one has been successful in counting the exact number of stones. They acted as defensive walls against raids conducted by the neighbouring villages in ancient times.

We started our journey back to Kohima at around 1:30 p.m and stopped at Mao Gate for dinner. After relishing the sumptuous meal we headed for Kohima. It was indeed an exhilarating trip which will linger in our memories for a long, long time to come.

4. Political Science Department: Trip to Khonoma Village:

As part of Co-curricular activities of the College, Department of Political Science, Don Bosco College, Kohima visited Khonoma Village and Dzuleke on 20th June 2019. The trip commenced with a visit to Khonoma village, the first green village in Asia. The Students were

animated and enlightened by the Chairman and council members about the functioning of village administration and also the various organisations within the village. They also elucidated on the functioning of different committees and verdicts given by the village council on various cases.

The formal program was chaired by Dr. Ao Sunep, Asst Prof, Department of Political Science BCK, and Maam Kezie Asst Prof Dept of Political Science DBCK highlighted the purpose for the visit and welcome address. Khonoma village council members animated the functioning of the village. Then followed by question hour, at the end of the program Mr. Zupenthung Shitiri HoD Asst Prof, Dept of Political Science

DBCK delivered the words of gratitude. The trip drew to a close with a sumptuous lunch prepared by the 5th semester students of the department at Dzuleke.

5. Sociology Department: Trip to Willong Village, Senapati District:

The Department of Sociology, Don Bosco College Kohima organised a field trip as a part of the academic departmental activity on 20th July 2019 and visited Willong village and Don Bosco College, Maram, Senapati district, Manipur. Willong is a historic village known for valour, scenic beauty and ancient relics. To this day no one has been successful in counting the exact number of the stones. They acted as defensive walls against raids conducted by the neighbouring villages in ancient times. The team had been benefitted by attending the field trip.

28 to 29-11-2019: Workshop for “New And Uprising Naga Writers”:

A workshop was held by the Kohima Educational Society at Ura hotel, in the presence of some prominent writers, publishers and journalists on the topic “New and Uprising Naga writers”

The workshop was attended by students of colleges as well as schools such as, Japfii Christian College, Don Bosco College, G. Rio School etc. The workshop was also kept open for all, who were interested in promoting Naga writing.

On 28th, the first day of the workshop, a small inaugural session was conducted which was followed by the speeches of the invitees. The first session began with Miss. Vishü Rita Krocha, the founder of Pen Thrill Publications, Kohima. She talked on the topic “Publishing in Nagaland: my experience”. She shared about the books that had been published in her publishing house and also talked about the hard work she does to run the publishing house. Miss Rita also said that things are possible only when they are done whole-heartedly.

The next invitee was Mrs. Bano Haralu, she spoke on the topic “Interpreting the role of Writers/Journalists in Naga society today”. She was a journalist in Doordarshan and NDTV and has also been awarded with the Nari Shakti Award in 2017, and also awarded with the Wildlife service Award. Currently, she is the Editor of the Nagaland Today newspaper, Dimapur. Mrs .Bano pointed out the changes occurring in the Naga society “such as today the Naga’s are writing about themselves by digging their roots “. She concluded her speech by appreciating the Naga writers like, Easterine Kire, Temsula Ao, etc. as they are helping us to know our roots.

The afternoon session began at 1, by Sir Oken Jeet Sandham, senior Journalist. He is a famous International Martial Artist. He wrote some books named Narendra Modi and Naga peace, Naga Paddy Man, Modi Walking on Elusive Naga Peace. He began his talk by giving a deep description about the history of Naga Political Issues and also mentioned that his books are mainly based on ‘the frame out Agreement of Nagaland’. From his own experience, he said that, ‘we should always try to write beyond what happens or what we see’. In conclusion, he encouraged the uprising writers by saying that, speaking and writing the truth may land you in trouble but one truth takes a stand. The last session for the day, was by Pradeep Phanjoubam, editor and publisher of Imphal free press. He spoke on the topic, ”Different styles of writing: Western and Indian styles”. He mainly talked about being empathetic and soft-wiring type of writing. Day 1 ended with this.

On 29th, Day 2 for the workshop began with the most prominent Naga writer Easterine Kire. Easterine kire, author, publisher and the winner of 1st Gordon Graham Prize for Naga Literature (GGPNL) in 2018. She holds as many more awards such as, the award for,

Best Journalist essay, the Tata Memorial award, Silver medal for best Creative writing in 1982, etc. She began her talk by sharing three rules that she uses in life as well as writing.

(1) Be humble: to have humanity and open yourself up, to learn more.

(2) Be teachable: to be teachable, need to be humble.

(3) Be Noble: Be noble because you are giving something away through writing.

She insisted the young writers, not to share their writings on social networks, not to ever publish their first draft, allow your writings to be edited.

She also revealed her editors advice that he gave her when she began writing. She mentioned the benefits of editing our writings, use of parables from Bible can make the writings more simple and eye catching, she added .Keeping the beginning sustainable and ending needs to be unpredictable. In conclusion, she added that always check or ask for reviews on your writing and improve if required.

The next person to speak was, Kethoser kevichusa, he is a preacher as well as an orator. He spoke on the topic “Life skills and the tools required for a fulfilling life”. He gave some beneficial tips, such as:-

(1) Sense of calling in life.

(2) Cause: know the cause of you being here.

(3) Courage.

(4) Commitment.

(5) Collaboration.

(6) Consistency.

(7) Content.

He said, we should learn to speak and belief the truth. In conclusion, he added that people search a secret behind success, but the secret of success is in the success itself. In the third session, the publisher of Morung Express, Mr. Akum Longchari talked on the topic “The importance of writing and literature for Naga society “. He is a scholar as well as an instructor, a presenter and a facilitator as well. He brought up two ways of truth, they are:

(1) Truth to hide.

(2) Truth to give light.

Through practical activities, he showed how we are starving for our self identity and following others direction, without knowing the truth. He also said that, the people staying in a place would know more about the problems, then the one sitting somewhere else and judging the people suffering, so it should also be written.

The speaker for the fourth session was again, Mr.Pradeep Phanjoubam. He talked about the culture of Head Hunting and said that we should have the feeling of empathy more than the feeling of sympathy.

He said: “We all have an ambition but we do not know whether it will end up a success or a failure.” He also shared his views on subjective reporting and post modernization.

The final session of this workshop was to be spoken by the chairman of Kohima Educational Society, Mr. P. Ngully, he is a specialised in HIV/AIDS, mental illness and have worked with many NGOs.

He shared from his research that there have been many cases about writers committing suicide just because it did not give them fame but only criticisms. He spoke about the ways our brain functions. He mentioned some qualities such as: Leader, Inventor, Teacher, User and Reader which can lead to a good writer without any mental illness.

In conclusion, the workshop conducted, could also be seen as a new step taken for the uplifting of the uprising Naga writers.
