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Agenda of the mentoring session:

The mentoring sessions for the 1st, 3rd and 5th semester students of shift-1 was held on 3rd and 4th August 2021. Due to lockdown, the mentoring sessions took place online through google meet and telephonic conversation/texts for students with poor internet/network connection. For the 1st semester students, introduction of the mentoring programme and self introduction of mentor and mentees took place. Furthermore, mentoring sessions for the 3rd and 5th semester students were also held by the respective mentors. The activity included collecting dry grasses and plants which were moulded down by knife and then lay out for further drying in front of vermi compost pit to feed them after a week along with organic waste materials. After the preparation of vermicompost feed was done, filterering of the harvested vermi was carried out by few students.

19 March 2022: Departmental Activity Political science

The 2nd Semester of the Department of Political Science, Don Bosco College, Kohima, carried out a **Workshop Cum Cleanliness Drive** on 19th of March, 2022 in Dzuleke Village. The workshop was conducted on the topic "**Working of Dzuleke Village Council**". Sociology

Education

Department of Education, DBCK made a field trip visit to Poilwa Village, Peren district on 19th March 2022, as part of the 2nd departmental ac activity.

Based on the theme "social connectedness", the objective of the field visit was to inculcate the sense of building social relationships by way of helping, showing care and support. During the visit, students and teachers visited few under privileged families, interacted with them and gifted some pulses, biscuits and energy drinks. The team also visited the Government primary school and High school of the village. The team further cleaned the village surroundings and made a brief visit to the sheep farm as well.

A total of 3 teachers and 55 students undertook the field trip.

Psychology

The 2nd Departmental activity was held on 21st March, 2022. For the activity, the Department conducted a field visit to Tabitha Enabling Academy (TEA) - An Institute for children with special needs, Located at Sepfiizou Colony Kohima and run by two OTS Alumni Vekutilu Vese and Asanuo Seb, currently the headmistresses of the institution. TEA was established in the year 2012 and is an unaided non-profit organisation. It is now a full-fledged school functioning with 6 classrooms and 2 other rooms for non-teaching activities. The school has a total of 12 teaching and non-teaching faculties with 25 differently-abled students.

The aims and objectives of TEA are: Conscientizing the people that children with special needs are capable of living a normal life, providing equal opportunities for their development, providing programs for specific learning disabilities, dealing with challenges such as speech or language impairments, mental retardation, hearing and visual impairment, autism and down syndrome.

Some of the facilities available are: Physiotherapy, vocational training, craft making, pottery, occupational therapy/daily living skills, personal hygiene, home-based education, Indian Sign language, speech therapy and spiritual education through learning from the Bible, pictures and songs.

The students were made to visit the different classrooms and interact with the teachers and students as well as observe them. They also visited the vocational training room where few students with severe disabilities were made to engage in tailoring and stitching. It was observed that the vocational students were well trained and were able to stitch products such as shopping bags, aprons, hot-pot mats etc. The products they make are put to sale and 10% of the total amount goes to the student's welfare account. Our students also helped them by purchasing few products.

The students had a fruitful interaction with the students and teachers and also took down notes as they interacted. They also interacted with the headmistress and she stressed on the need for more trained special education teachers and the need to sensitize both parents and the community of the prevalent disabilities and also showing acceptance by providing love and care to children with special needs.

The Department of psychology had an enriching field visit which was both beneficial and informative. The department also provided fruits to the students and it was a memorable experience.

The NSS Unit 6, Don Bosco College Kohima Observed **World Forestry day on the 21**st **March 2022** in collaboration with **Forest Department Kohima** under the theme 'Forests and sustainable production and consumption'. The Forest Department provided tree saplings for the activity and the NSS volunteers participated in the observation through tree plantation drive in and around Kohima town. The activity was a success and the volunteers also documented the activity in their respective places.

24-25 March 2022: Awareness Programme on Competitive Exam
