Botany

On the 21st of September, 2024, the Department of Botany undertook an educational field visit to Root on Roof, a sustainable urban agriculture initiative located at Old Minister Hill, Kohima, Nagaland. Ms. Leginino Yhoshu, the visionary proprietor, provided a comprehensive overview of the inception of Root on Roof, explaining how the initiative was conceived during the COVID-19 pandemic as a response to the growing demand for locally sourced, pesticide-free produce. The enterprise has since evolved into a model of urban organic farming, promoting agroecological practices within a limited rooftop space.

During the tour of the farm, Ms. Yhoshu showcased a diverse array of salad greens and leafy vegetables cultivated through organic farming techniques, such as crop rotation, vermicomposting, and the use of biofertilizers. These sustainable farming methods ensure the production of high-quality, nutrient-rich produce without the application of synthetic chemicals, making the farm's output highly sought after by health-conscious consumers and local markets.

Ms. Yhoshu emphasized the significance of organic farming in today's agricultural landscape, particularly in urban areas where space is limited, but the demand for organic, non-GMO, and eco-friendly produce is on the rise. She further elaborated on how organic farming

contributes to environmental conservation by enhancing soil health, promoting biodiversity, and reducing the carbon footprint associated with conventional farming practices.

The field visit not only provided insight into innovative urban farming solutions but also reinforced the importance of adopting sustainable agricultural practices in response to the growing global food security and environmental challenges.

Dr Singh has 8 years of teaching experience expertise in phonology, Morphology and language documentation. He completed 2 Major research projects and is currently engaged in other and delivered 17 lectures as an invitee Resource Person. He presented 13 papers at National and International conferences. Dr Velhou expressed his profound appreciation to the guest and the attendees and emphasised the essenceof promoting Research Day as it is unique and special for everyone. As a gesture of appreciation the college presented Dr Singh's with a token of recognition.

Following the felicitation time was given to Dr Pinky Sagolsem (dept.of.English) DBCK to present her research paper. Dr Pinky presented on the topic "A Contrastive Study of Germination of Plosive Consonants in English and Manipuri Phonology". She discuss about what is Germination and mentioned that germination comes from Latin words "gemmnation-em doubling", related to Geminus "twin", seen in the astrological sign Gemini, which means, as the name suggests, the doublingof consonants, that is, the change which produces a sequence of two identical consonants starting from a single starting consonants. Dr Pinky also debated that in phonetics, germination and consonants elongation happens when a spoken consonant is pronounced for an audibly longer period of time than a short consonant.

In the feedback session special invitee Dr Singh acknowledged Dr Pinky's well structured and excellent work, her informative and engaging presentation. Dr Singh also mentioned long associations with the college. He further suggests a constructive and friendly suggestion that whoever is interested in association with her then they can create a Naga language as well. He concluded by stating that he would be delighted to see the paper in the form of a published paper in the near future.

19thOctober 2024: Intellectual Property Rights Cell Workshop, focusing on the theme 'Statutes of Patent Filing Protocols.'

The Intellectual Property Rights (IPR) Cell successfully hosted its second IPR Workshop. focusing on the theme 'Statutes of Patent Filing Protocols.' The event was honored by the presence of Mr. KekuncilLtu, a distinguished Scientist 'B' from NASTEC (National Science and Technology terpreεκδη Council). Mr. Ltu delivered an in-depth discourse on the intricacies of patent law, copyrights, and intellectual property management, both within the Indian jurisdiction and in international frameworks.

During his presentation, Mr. Ltu emphasized the strategic importance of securing patents as a critical element in protecting innovative inventions, thus safeguarding the intellectual capital of inventors and organizations. He underscored the legislative foundation of the Patents Act. 1970, and elaborated on the various amendments that have aligned India's patent framework with global standards, particularly after the TRIPS Agreement. His talk also dissected the procedural nuances of patent filing, delineating the statutory protocols, best practices, and the common pitfalls that applicants should avoid during patent prosecution.

Further, Mr. Ltu delved into the technical dimensions of patentability, focusing on the requirements of novelty, inventive step, and industrial applicability. He stressed the importance of conducting thorough prior art searches and understanding the specific exclusions under Section 3 and 4 of the Patents Act, which address what cannot be patented, including abstract ideas, algorithms, and naturally occurring substances. His comprehensive session provided the participants with critical insights into the lifecycle of patents-from drafting a precise specification to the procedural steps involved in national and international patent filings under the PCT (Patent Cooperation Treaty) and Paris Convention.

By illustrating these key points, Mr. Ltu aimed to elevate the understanding of the participants regarding the strategic value patents hold in fostering innovation, promoting competitiveness, and ensuring commercial success in a rapidly evolving technological landscape.

24 October 2024:

The speaker mentioned the psychological effects as a consequence of usage of Social Media which includes social comparison, increased anxiety and depression, fear of missing out (FOMO) and cyber bullying which results in profound emotional distress. The speaker also addressed the rising issue of sleep disorders as well as doom scrolling/doom surfing which are not only affecting teens and young adults but also the older generation.

Dr. Rukuoviu also stated that having sleep problems, ignoring real life interactions, falling behind on personal goals, social comparison resulting in reduced self-esteem, vision problems, weight gain and so on could be a sign that one needs a digital detox which is to reduce the use of devices.

The speaker also mentioned that setting clear goals, choosing the right time and informing people around you about your move towards digital detox would help the process significantly. She also mentioned how maintaining a journal and a healthy lifestyle including spending time outdoors can help one in the process of detoxification. She also encouraged the students to print hard copies of their study materials to study. Digital detox can result in improved mental health, better sleep quality by avoiding screen time before sleep, stronger connections, increased self-awareness without the influence from social media and an improved overall well-being.

The talk concluded with a call to action, urging attendees to take small but meaningful steps towards a balanced digital life. It is emphasised that while technology is essential, using it mindfully is key to mental clarity, productivity, and emotional well-being.
